

Health Camps

A good way to provide basic health services and health education to a large number of unreached persons is through Health camps.

A settlement close to Nizamuddin basti is the Sarai Kale Khan. Many persons here have not seen a Doctor for several months. Not because they do not fall ill, but because there are no good medical facilities close by.



When the Hope Project held a camp at this place, more than 300 people of all ages thronged it. They came both to seek health care services and know more from the health education that was being provided (particularly relating to HIV/AIDS).

Erstwhile Ragpickers



Special classes are held at The Hope Project for children who pick rags during the day to earn a living. Through the year, they and their parents are encouraged to pursue education during the better half of the day. Many young erstwhile ragpicking children have become bright students in school.

Hope on Wheels Brings Hope to Homeless

The Mobile Medical Unit aptly named 'Hope on Wheels' is serving the needy and poor, especially homeless women and children. We have identified three new locations which are completely bereft of any health care services. The settlement under the Okhla flyover (photo) is one such location, where people take shelter. The medical team comprises of a doctor, nurse and a pharmacist and provides primary health care to the poor.



The other places that the Mobile Medical Unit visits are Sunder Nursery (photo) and Srinivas Puri – both migrant settlements. Livelihood conditions are very poor. Basic infrastructure is missing: housing, drinking water and drainage facilities.



Rubina

Rubina, is a 24 year old single parent with three children. Her oldest daughter was diagnosed with a hole in her heart. As a result her growth was stunted. She received medical help and now this hole in her little heart has healed.



The support and help Rubina received at the Hope Project enabled her to step out of an abusive relationship with a alcoholic husband who had also taken another wife.

Rubina's three children were taken care of at the Crèche or day care centre. Now the oldest has moved into the Nursery while the younger two are at the Crèche. Here they are constructively engaged and provided with loving care besides nutrition until she returns to pick them up in the evening.

With the assurance that her children are taken care of well she was encouraged to seek employment which allows her to bring up her three children independently.

Anwari

There are many like Anwari in the basti who are affected by Tuberculosis. Living with an alcoholic husband who used to abuse and beat her almost every day is no better than having to fend for herself and her three children by begging for alms. Her health does not permit Anwari to take up a regular job. She will be better able to help herself and her three children once she is cured of TB.

Persons like Anwari who have Tuberculosis are not able to get cured even if medicines are provided free of cost. Protein supplementation in the form of milk and eggs is also provided bi-weekly along with the medicines to ensure that they continue their medication and get completely cured.



Shahjahan

Shahjahan is a 24 year old homely girl from a lower middle class Muslim family. Shahjahan's father has a small tea stall. The financial status of Shahjahan's family is really bad and as a result she dropped out of school from Class X. Staff at The Hope Project encouraged Shahjahan to enroll for a course in Geriatrics as she had the aptitude and interest for it.

Her father and step mother gave her request a deaf ear as they felt she was better off at home. Financial support for the six month course of was provided by The Hope Project and Shahjahan successfully completed her course. Soon after, she was provided training at a large Government hospital to gain experience.

She is now working as a trainee and gets a monthly stipend of Rs.1800. She is preparing for her Class X examination again. This time she will appear for the exam through the National Institute of Open School (NIOS) after which she will clear her Class XII exams in a similar manner. Once she completes her higher secondary education, she will be eligible for better paying jobs and earn up to Rs 6000 a month. She says:



"The Hope Project made my dreams come true. Earlier I used to see different things in the market but kept all my wishes in my small heart but now I can get what I like, I don't need to think before buying it because I am earning. I am encouraging my younger brothers and sister to also go for higher studies and have offered to sponsor them for it!"
